

Copeland Community Traffic Group [CCTG]

The Copeland Community Traffic Group needs a chairman and is seeking nominations from the affected villages.

The CCTG was formed earlier this year to act as a stronger voice for the village populations affected by rat-run traffic caused by congestion on the A595. Membership has been drawn from Parish Councils and other Groups formed to alleviate traffic problems [eg the Cold Fell Action Group].

The CCTG has hitherto been chaired by a member of the Cumbria Constabulary but this was only temporary until the Group was established. None of the current delegates felt able to take on the chairmanship so nominations are being sought from the populations most affected by Traffic.

- To control the use of rat runs through the towns and villages of Copeland, specifically at Sellafield muster times
- To promote safer driving

By:

- Encouraging community speed-watch teams
- Gathering information of business/contractor road users driving poorly and using this information to encourage businesses to promote safer driving amongst their workforce
- Providing a single view with greater impact from the whole community to the A595 Liaison group.

These aims will be achieved through Education, Enforcement and Engineering.
