INCIDENTS OF NOTE

- Thornhill. Report of excessive noise from house. No officers available. Advice to contact environment agency
- Thornhill. Report of possible stolen motorbike. No valid documents so likelihood that it had been abandoned
- Thornhill. Concern for welfare. Individual referred to mental health team for support
- Thornhill. Vehicle with no insurance seized and owner reported for offences
- Beckermet. Sandstone stolen from wall on regular basis
- Thornhill. 2 vehicle collision with minor injury
- Beckermet. Report of car driving erratically. Number given was no trace. Car not located.
- Thornhill. Damage to pedestrian railings. Car driver located and dealt with by police.
- Thornhill. Report of noisy neighbours. Music turned down prior to police attendance
- Thornhill. A595 3 cows loose on road. Placed in a nearby field
- Thornhill. Voices heard at rear of premises. Police attended and checked and nothing untoward found
- Thornhill. Children causing problems playing with balls. PCSOs to make hi viz patrols
- Thornhill. Locals blocking path of bus and shouting abusive comments to driver. Public order offence recorded.

If you want to receive information but do not wish to be responsible for a larger group, you are still welcome to make use of this messaging system.

As well as Cumbria Constabulary the partners providing information are Cumbria County Council, Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service and Cumbria Neighbourhood Watch Association. If you do not have internet access, contact your local PCSO and they will aid in registering your details on the system.
