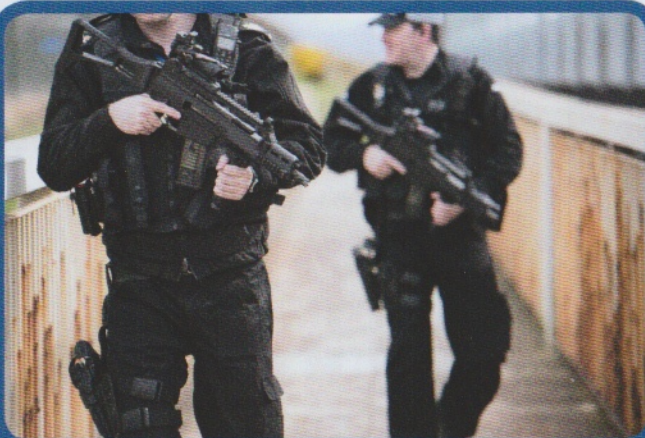

The Civil Nuclear Constabulary is dedicated to protecting Nuclear Licensed Sites, which involves patrolling within the site and the surrounding area.

Project Servator is an effective tactic that helps deter and detect a wide range of suspicious behavior, whilst providing reassurance to the public.

It comprises unpredictable, intelligence led activity involving specially trained officers.

However, this is nothing new and is just another tool that we can use to aid in the detection of suspicious activity.

What you will see

You will see a highly visible police presence that will turn up unannounced in locations across Sellafield Site and in the surrounding areas. This police activity will be unpredictable in timing and duration.

Some locations may not see a visible deployment for a week, while others may see highly visible activity on a regular basis

The key to all of this is; **Unpredictability!**

You may encounter Project Servator deployments, so don't be surprised if you see one— they are there to help encourage you to report suspicious activity. So feel free to chat with them if you want to find out more.
